

Last week Barb Bonfert and I attended a diocesan meeting on Ensuring Human Dignity. Among the topics presented was the revised Policy for the Protection of Minors and Young People

for the diocese. We have had such a policy for over 10 years now; but this gives more definition and clarity to our efforts to protect, not only young people, but vulnerable adults as well. Parish staff and others will take training on that subject in addition to the training on protecting youth from abuse, which we must renew every five years. The policy specifies more clearly the roles of a number of diocesan positions involved in this effort and the responsibilities of the Review Board, which makes recommendations to the bishop after examining allegations of abuse by priests or deacons. Thankfully, the Board has only had to do this twice in the past seven years.

If you have knowledge of abuse that has been committed by a cleric, Church employee, or Church volunteer, you are urged to report the abuse to the local police department and Child and Protection Services. You should also contact Mr. Frank DiLallo, Diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator at 419.214.4880. The Church is committed to cooperate with civil authorities in their investigations, and our employees and volunteers (especially in our Religious Education Program) are required to report known or suspected abuse to proper authorities. As Coordinator of Religious Education, Barb Bonfert serves as the Compliance Officer for our parish, ensuring proper procedures are followed.

Soon the Annual Catholic Appeal (A.C.A.) will begin once again, with the initial Commitment Weekend this February 10-11. I was pleased that, for the first time in many years, St. Caspar met and exceeded its goal in the campaign, and we will be receiving a small amount of money back. The A.C.A. provides for many diocesan services. Among other things, it assists us in covering the weekly Spanish Mass by helping secure celebrants and paying for expenses for two of four Sundays a month. So it has that major effect here, as well as assisting many other programs. It has my financial support; I hope it will have yours as well.

A Quote from St. Thérèse of Lisieux: At last I have found my vocation. My vocation is love.



La semana pasada Barb Bonfert y yo fuimos a una junta diocesana en Asegurar La Dignidad Humana. Entre los temas presentados, uno de ellos fue la póliza revisada sobre la Protección de los Menores y La Gente Joven por la diócesis. Hemos tenido esa póliza por más de 10 años, pero esto le da más definición y claridad a nuestros esfuerzos para proteger, no solamente a la gente joven, pero también a los adultos vulnerables. El equipo de la parroquia y otros formarán parte de un entrenamiento sobre el tema encima de un entrenamiento que se tiene que renovar cada 5 años en cómo proteger a los jóvenes del abuso. La póliza especifica más claramente los papeles que representan las posiciones diocesanas involucradas en este esfuerzo y las responsabilidades del Consejo de Revisión que da recomendaciones al obispo después de haber examinado las acusaciones de abuso hacia sacerdotes o diáconos. Agradecidamente, el Consejo solamente ha tenido que hacer esto dos veces durante los últimos siete años.

Si ustedes saben que un abuso ha sido cometido por un clérigo, empleado de la Iglesia o un voluntario de la Iglesia, se les encarga de que reporten el abuso a las autoridades locales y al Servicio de Protección de Menores. También, deben contactar al Sr. Frank DiLallo quién es el Coordinador Diocesano de Asistencia a las Víctimas. Se pueden contactar con él llamando al 419-214-4880. La Iglesia está comprometida a cooperar con las autoridades civiles en sus investigaciones, y nuestros empleados y voluntarios (especialmente en nuestro Programa de Educación Religiosa) están obligados a reportar abuso o cualquier sospecha de abuso a las autoridades. Como coordinadora de la Educación Religiosa, Barb Bonfert trabaja como oficial de cumplimiento, asegurándose de que los procedimientos apropiados se sigan.

Pronto, la Apelación Católica Anual comenzará una vez más con el Fin De Semana de Obligación Inicial este febrero 10-11. Estuve muy contento de que por primera vez en en muchos años, San Gaspar cumplió y excedió su meta en la campaña. Por ese logro, recibiremos una pequeña suma de dinero de regreso. La ACA (abrv. Inglés) provee para muchos servicios diocesanos. Entre otras cosas, nos asiste en cubrir la Misa en español cada semana. Ayuda a asegurar las personas que ofrecen la misa y a pagar los gastos de dos domingos sobre

cuatro. Entonces, tiene más efecto en esto y otros programas. Tiene mi apoyo financiero. Espero que también tenga el suyo.
