

Beautification Update from Fr. Todd following "Show and Tell" Open Parish Meetings

"Unless the LORD build the house, they labor in vain who build." PS 127:1

Thank you for attending our recent "Show and Tell" open parish meetings regarding the proposed plans for the beautification of our sanctuary. We have conducted three meetings so far. We plan to have a Spanish language "Show and Tell" meeting for our Spanish language parishioners on Sunday, November 23, 2025. The two meetings which were held on Sunday and Tuesday had mostly adults of the parish in attendance. Thank you. We added one more meeting for Religious Education ministry students, grades 5-12, the next day on Wednesday evening. Just a side note... We were very surprised how engaged the young people were in the beautification presentation! They really do care about the beauty of our sanctuary! Overall, almost everyone who attended the meetings seemed excited for the potential design and urged the committee to continue the process.

The Beautification Committee held a meeting on November 5, 2025 to discuss all the input that had been offered at the "Show and Tell" meetings. We reviewed our process and agreed that we have been faithful to the guidance and recommendations which were given to us about how to do the process. Additionally, we have not received any more input, suggestions, or ideas after the "Show and Tell" meetings. The committee agreed that, overall, those who attended the "Show and Tell" meetings seemed excited for the potential design that was presented and urged the committee to continue the process. The committee has been actively seeking answers to the questions which were asked. We have also reviewed suggestions which were made for further consideration. For example, it was asked, "Do we have to have a crucifix or can it be the risen Christ?" The committee has researched and affirmed that the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, which governs and regulates all matters of liturgy and worship, establishes in article number 308 the fact that a crucifix must be visible in the sanctuary for all to see.

What's next? We expect to have a Parish Leadership meeting soon to discuss how to move forward. The leadership of the parish includes Pastoral Council, Finance Council, Maintenance Committee, Liturgy Committee, Cemetery Board members, Knights of Columbus officers, St. Therese Circle officers, St. Bernadette Circle officers, Spanish Ministry Leadership and Parish Staff. Again, at this meeting we will discuss how to move forward. We will present to the leadership group the necessary requirements of the Diocese of Toledo that will allow us to move forward. We will discuss parish input. We will also discuss potential additional projects which are beyond the original scope of the Sanctuary Beautification focus. These may include: possibly moving the baptismal font to the inside main entrance of the church; possibly re-purposing the current baptismal font area for a shrine to St. Caspar; possibly re-painting the entire interior of the church; and possibly enhancing the Stations of the Cross. We will also have a conversation about the need for additional funding beyond the Living Christ capital campaign funds.

Thank you for your continued prayerful support for our parish beautification project.

Coordinators of Religious Education Cheryl Head and Barb Bonfert smelled the smoke after ending a catechists meeting. Thankfully, the arsonist closed the door to the room, which contained the fire. Damage totaled about \$10,000. The entire church could have been lost if the door had been left open.


