A Look In The Past 175 Years In Our Parish

After six months of fundraising, \$1,093,069 had been pledged toward the initial goal of \$1.4 million.

In late summer 2002 ground was officially broken for the building project. (Indicating the parish leadership's foresight, a basement area beneath the Parish Life Center was included. Although no immediate plans for the area, it was felt the additional cost would be worth it for future use. They remembered spending nearly \$100,000 in the 1980s to excavate under the church for classroom space.) The Parish Life Center and other upgrades were completed in late summer of 2003.



Rest In Peace

Rev. Robert Joseph Kill, a senior status priest of the Diocese of Toledo, died on Sunday afternoon, November 16, 2025, at The Meadows of Delphos. He was 81 years old.

He was born June 12, 1944 at

home in Landeck to Eugene F. and Rosalia B. (Gengler) Kill who both preceded him in death. Father Kill was a graduate from Pontifical College, Josephinum, Worthington. He was ordained April 3, 1971 in Columbus, Ohio. He had served as pastor at Immaculate Conception Catholic Church, Bellevue, St. John the Baptist Catholic Church, Continental, St. Mary's Catholic Church, Holgate, St. Paul's Catholic Church, Hamler, St. Michael's Ridge Catholic Church, Defiance, St. Isidore Catholic Church, Defiance/Sherwood, and St. Barbara Catholic Church, Cloverdale.

He was a member of the Coast Guard Auxiliary and an avid fisherman and outdoorsman. When asked what some of his fondest memories were, outside of his pastoral duties, he recalled the many camping trips he took with his mother and sisters. He is also preceded in death by two sisters, Sister Mary Thomas OSF (Beatrice Kill) and Sister Marietta OSF (Marilyn Kill). Father Kill is survived by a close friend and housekeeper for close to 50 years, Anita Bertsch of Delphos.
