

A Look In The Past 175 Years In Our Parish

Have you ever noticed the tile artwork in the hall between the Pope John XXIII Room and Parish Life Center? Parish children were invited to create a piece of artwork to be imprinted on a tile for the Parish Life Center building project to show the future belongs to our children.

Parish youth helped design and plan the Youth Room as well as doing some of the painting and preparation work.

The Family of Love sculpture on the wall of the Parish Life Center lobby includes petals with the names of persons, families, and organizations who pledged or provided support to the building project.

Did you ever notice the stones embedded in the Parish Life Center's canopy pillars? These stones came from the second St. Caspar Church, which was located at the corner of Clinton and Jefferson streets in Wauseon. IHC are the first three letters of Jesus' name in ancient Greek. One stone indicates that church was erected in 1895 but with St. Caspar's Church mistakenly printed as St. Casper.



Prayer to the Holy Family


