Epiphany is a Season of Light

Epiphany is a season of worship because it deals with the Glory of God manifested in Jesus. The season begins with the Wise Men coming to worship the newborn King. The season ends with the worship experience on the mount of Transfiguration. When people see Jesus as God's Son, they instinctively fall down to worship him as Lord.

The name "Epiphany" mean "Manifestation". The light manifests itself in the darkness, God reveals himself in Jesus, and the glory of God is seen in Jesus. The Epiphany season extends from six to nine Sundays. The number of weeks observed depends upon the date of Easter and the beginning date of Lent.

Epiphany is a season of light, the light that shines and reveals. The symbol is the Epiphany Star. The light burns so that all may see truth and the way to God.

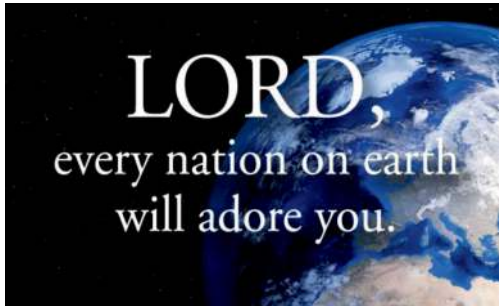

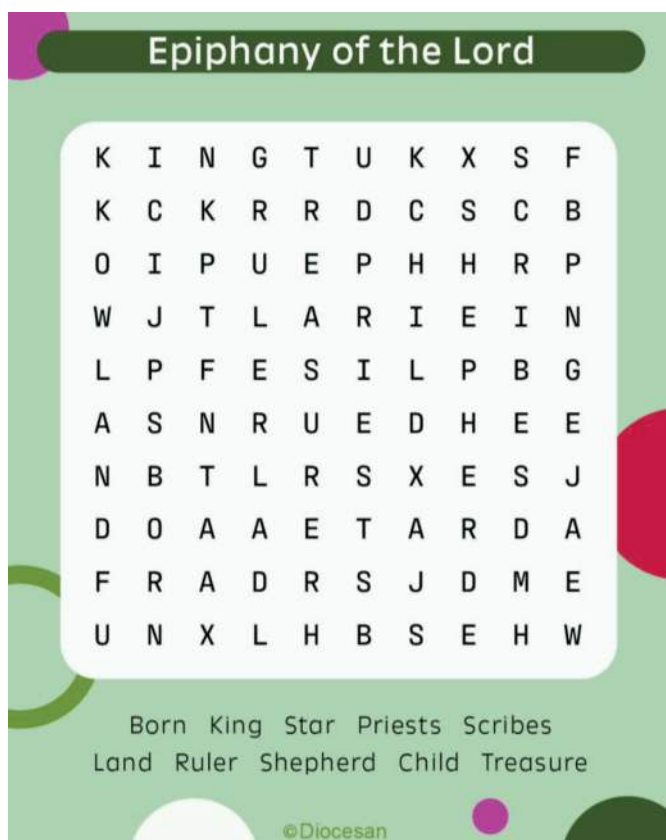


Women's Health Resource in Wauseon is in need of items for their clinic. These are the items:

Dear St. Caspar Family,

I want to provide you some updated information about our Sanctuary Beautification project. I have written Bishop Thomas requesting his formal permission to proceed with our plans. The parish started considering beautification of our sanctuary after his encouragement over 6 years ago. St. Caspar Parish leadership named ‘sanctuary beautification’ as one of our *Living Christ Capital Campaign* priorities when we started the campaign in 2022. Thank you for staying faithful to your campaign pledge. Fulfillment of your pledge will help us achieve our beautification plans.

Just a reminder, the Beautification Committee members are: Mrs. Sue Davis, Mrs. Sue Creps, Mrs. Deb Spieles, Mrs. Suzy Osborne, Mr. Burt Derringer, Mr. Steve Sekula, and myself. The committee worked with the worship space design consultants Groth Design Group out of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Mr. Paul Berribeau, our lead liturgical consultant from Groth Design Group, produced the sanctuary concept design which was presented at our “Show & Tell” meetings.

The Beautification Committee held four open parish “Show & Tell” meetings presenting and explaining the work of the committee and the concept design. Two adult meetings were held, one meeting for the religious education students grades 5-12, and one meeting for the Spanish language group rounded out the presentations. Finally, on December 16, 2025 we held an all-Parish Leadership meeting including Pastoral Council, Finance Council, Maintenance Committee, Liturgy Committee, Cemetery Board members, Knights of Columbus officers, St. Therese Circle officers, St. Bernadette Circle officers, Spanish Ministry Leadership, Guadalupe Society and Parish Staff. There was nearly unanimous agreement from parish leadership to move forward with the Groth Design Group’s sanctuary design as it was presented at our “Show & Tell” meetings. Thank you to our Parish Leadership groups for your ministry and guidance.

After reviewing options for construction, we have agreed to work with Boyers Construction Company of Pettisville, Ohio here in Fulton County. A few generations ago, Boyers Construction Company built our present St. Caspar Church. While Boyers are busy with many building projects, they are willing to take on our beautification project. Finance Council has approved expending \$17,000 from the *Living Christ Capital Campaign* to engage Boyers Construction Company at our November 11, 2025 regular meeting in anticipation of the project moving forward.

The approval process from Bishop Thomas and the Diocese of Toledo will include the review and approval of the contract agreement between St. Caspar Parish and Boyers Construction Company. This review and approval will be done by diocesan attorney, Mr. Tom Antonini. Once we hear from Bishop Thomas and Mr. Antonini, then our official relationship with Boyers Construction Company can begin. Boyers Construction Company will take the sanctuary designs from Groth Design Group and put them into working construction documents. As you know, Reggie Buehrer of Window Creations of Ottoville, Ohio has been involved in creating the art glass features of the sanctuary design. Groth, Boyers, and Window Creations will be working together to create Permit Drawings and specifications for the sanctuary design. These will be presented to the Diocesan Building Commission in the regular process.

Please know, parish leadership has also recommended that additional projects should be completed along with the sanctuary beautification. These projects include painting the entire interior of



the church's worship space; relocating the baptismal font and baptism liturgy space to the inside main entrance of the church (within the worship space); creating an enshrinement for a new St. Caspar statue (the statue is a gift to the parish family funded by the St. Caspar Rosary Altar Society-St. Bernadette Circle); and, finally, enhancing our current Stations of the Cross. These projects were outside the original scope of the Beautification Committee's work, but the committee is willing to study and make plans for all these add-on projects including cost estimates. St. Caspar Parish Finance Council will be working to help secure the additional funding needed once the full scope of the additional projects is identified and estimates are made.

Funding for the sanctuary beautification project will come in part from the *Living Christ Capital Campaign*. Additional funds will be needed to complete the whole project. St. Caspar Parish Leadership expects that a 'soft, in-house capital campaign' will be needed pay the cost of all the desired projects we have identified, including the recent add-on projects. Below is a brief summary of our *Living Christ Capital Campaign*:

Living Christ Capital Campaign for St. Caspar began September 2022 to be finished 2027

Parish goal = \$395,000

St. Caspar Pledged \$570,360 – 44% over Parish goal

Parish portion expected if all pledges are honored = \$224,000

St. Caspar Parish has spent \$55,166.82 of our *Living Christ Capital Campaign* funds for the first priorities of our case statement:

Security project complete & final cost =	\$26,333.92
Beautification cost to date =	\$20,844.90
Outdoor painting complete & final cost =	\$ 7,988.00

St. Caspar Parish has already received a \$5,000 gift from one family specifically for the beautification project. The family has indicated there will be another \$5,000 after the sale of an estate. The St. Caspar Knights of Columbus Council will also have a donation for the beautification project. These gifts will be a good start for the soft, in-house capital campaign.

Now we will wait for Bishop Thomas' formal written permission to move ahead with our project. Once we get his written approval, then we will contact Boyers Construction Company to produce a contract agreement for the initial phase of the work. We will have Mr. Antonini review and approve it. Then Boyers will work to create Permit Drawings and specifications for the sanctuary design that will be presented to the Diocesan Building Commission in the regular process.

We are reminded from Psalm 127:1 "*Unless the LORD builds the house, they who build it labor in vain...*" We rely on the help of our Lord, Jesus Christ, Blessed Mother Mary and St. Joseph, the Worker to help us on our way.
